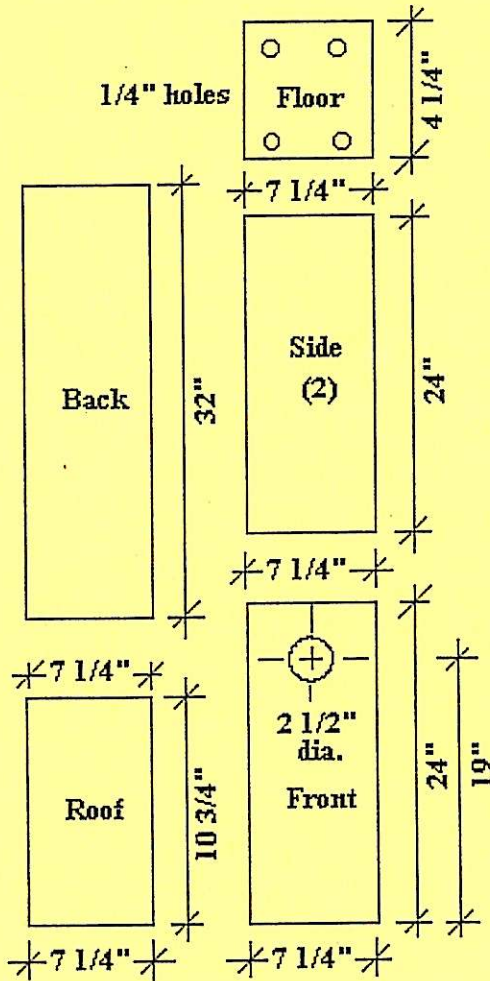
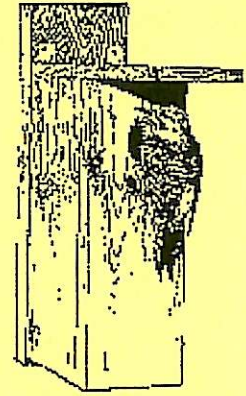
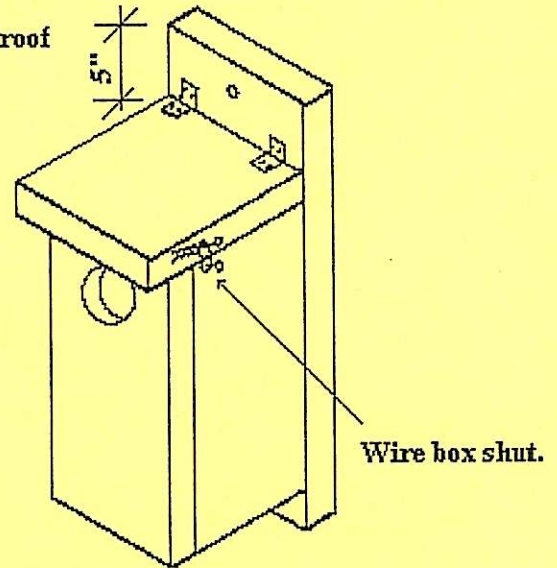


Northern Flicker Nest Box

The flicker is a common woodpecker in woodlands distinguished by its yellow tail feathers and red patch on the back of the head and neck. They nest in wooded areas and in town. Flickers are excavators and are more likely to use a nest box if it is completely filled and packed with sawdust. This simulates a dead tree with a rotting inside. Boxes should be attached to a post and placed 4-6 feet high. A 1 1/2" thick rough cut cedar material is preferred.



Hinge or cleat roof for cleaning.



Fill box to top with sawdust.
