Discussion - Water Update

Mr. Don Quicksall and Mr. Matt Robinette attended the meeting to give the final update on the SR 83 Water Extension. He stated that there were some issue about the grass not growing in correctly and Don Wells stated that he will replant the grass seed. Mr. Quicksall stated that the project is complete. Mr. Robinette stated that he hasn't looked at the grass for a couple weeks but will look later in the spring. Mr. Quicksall stated that he would like to start coming down once a month to see how things are going. The Commissioners stated that they would appreciate that. The Commissioners thanked Mr. Quicksall for attending.

Discussion - Public Records Request

Mr. Stahl stated that we have received a letter written by Todd Ellsworth, legal counsel to Ms. Cheryl Willis stating that due to a recent Supreme Court Ruling, we will not go any further with the records request. Mr. Stahl stated that he is in favor of signing this letter since it has cost the county \$6,187.50 to respond to the request to date. Mr. Shryock stated that he is in favor of making her come in and request the additional records and then presenting her with the letter. Mr. Fischer stated that he would like to discuss the issue with Mr. Batchelor before making the final decision.

T.J. Justice - Priority Projects

Mr. T.J. Justice attended the meeting to discuss Priority Projects for ARC/GOA. He stated that he would like to the Commissioners to consider working with him to put a caucus system in place for OMEGA Funding. He feels this will help the county prioritize our grant funding requests that go to OMEGA. The Commissioners would appoint the Caucus and it would consist of the County Commissioners, and elected County Official, Mayors from all municipalities, a Township Trustee, an Elected At-Large-Member, Private Sector Member, Community Action Organizer, Regional Planning Director, and a Member-At-Large. The Commissioners feel this would be a benefit to the county. Mr. Justice stated that he will go to OMEGA to get their approval as well. Mr. Shryock stated that he would like to see OMEGA require a scoring system from each county that presents a grant request to them. He feels this will make the whole process better for all involved. Mr. Justice stated that he hopes to work with the new director from OMEGA and this will in turn make their decisions on the grant requests much easier. The Commissioners thanked him for the information.

Discussion –Schooler Family Foundation Grant

Mr. T. J. Justice attended the meeting to update the Commissioners on the Schooler Family Foundation \$300,000 grant that the County received last Friday. He stated that the family will allow \$125,000 as leverage to access other funds in order for the Port Authority to acquire land. \$25,000 set aside for lease subsidies. An example would be ITM Marketing, \$10,000 matching grant to the Buehler's Foundation Grant. \$50,000 to allow us to do a joint marketing effort with Knox County. \$50,000 to the Revolving loan Fund, \$10,000 to help with marketing, communication and to develop a workforce, and also 5,000 to promote the Columbus to Pittsburgh Corridor. He stated that they have \$2,000 set aside to have a contest with the best idea to promote economic development in the county. The Commissioners congratulated him on his hard work in getting this grant and thanked him for attending and giving the update. Mr. Justice stated that he feels this it is a very noble gesture on behalf of the Schooler family and we are all very appreciative of the contribution.

Discussion - Juvenile Community Service Program

Mr. Doug Schonauer attended the meeting to give a brief description of a contract that the Commissioners Office received about the Juvenile Community Service Program. He stated that the program only has one juvenile placed at a time. They also do not place any youths where adult community service is being utilized. He stated that they do a lot of weekend community service as well. Mr. Stahl asked how the Commissioners office could utilize this program. Mr. Schonauer stated that if we need someone to do menial tasks such as filing or cleaning. It would normally consist of one or two hours a day. Mr. Shryock stated that if we can accommodate the court or help a youth, this office would be glad to assist in that. Mr. Schonauer stated that they also have a request form that they can help at a special event. The Commissioners thanked him for his attendance.
