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Joseph Robertson-Bond Council


Mr. Joseph Robertson, Hilltop Securities, Inc. attended the meeting to discuss additional bonding options for the New Justice Center, EMS building, CCCTA, the Health Department/Morgue Renovations as well as adding three roof projects, the Annex, Probate/Juvenile Court and the Court House. Mr. Robertson gave a recap of the Notes they obtained on December 29, 2021 for the sum of \$10 million, these Notes will need to be turned into Bonds before December 29, 2022. Mr. Robertson will work on completing a new spreadsheet to show these additional projects. The county could potentially end up with multiple bonds, however there will be one resolution that combines them all together. He also stated the county would have 3 years to reasonable spend 85% of the bond money per the IRS rule. Mr. Robertson will work on a schedule to issue the bonds and come back to present this to the Commissioners at a later time.
