Mrs. Emily Marrison-OSU Extension -County Services Renovations

At 9:30 a.m. Mrs. Emily Marrison, Family and Consumer Sciences Educator with the OSU Extension Office came to discuss with the Commissioners some ideas she has for the upcoming County Services Renovations. Once the Hopewell Renovations are complete for the new Coshocton Community Health Department and our county health department, WIC and Maternal and Child Health Department makes the move to the new building the current County Services building will have some areas left to be renovated for the offices that will remain in that building. Currently, Mrs. Marrison teaches Dining with Diabetes and Food Preservation classes throughout the year as well as some Kids Cooking Classes to over 100 county youth. Mrs. Marrison is unable to teach these classes in her office and must utilize space in local churches as well as KnoHoCo. Mrs. Marrison talked about the struggle this is to her and encourage the Commissioners to think about adding a small kitchen to the community room during the renovations. Mr. Rusty Dreher, Fire Chief spoke with Mr. Brent Endsley in reference to a kitchen add-on at the County Services Building and it was stated during the meeting that aa grease omitting vapor would need to be installed in a kitchen was added. Mr. Shryock thanked Mrs. Marrison for her time and stated that he realized the importance of her classes in our community.

## Mr. Mike Brugger-EMS Update

At 10:00 a.m. Mr. Mike Brugger, Tekton gave the commissioners' a brief update in regard to the new EMS Building Project. Currently, Mr. Brugger said all at the site is going well, the excavating crew is moving right along. Also noted, the soil is compacting very well and the

pylons would be going in as well. Once all pylons are installed and inspected the beams will be poured. As of now, there is no concern about the delivery of products for this build. As of date there has been five (5) change orders submitted for approval, four(4) of which were code related. In addition, there has been two(2) pay request submitted as well. Mrs. Beck let the Commissioners know that she has approved the rendering for the sign that is to be placed in front of the construction site. Mr. Wells from Albert Excavating will be working on the water line that is to be ran from the city to the site and should have this complete by October 1st. Mr. Brugger stated the next step would be to see the rectangle pylons capped with graveling and concrete beams for outside and inside building-structural support. The completion date for this project is October 1, 20223, which allows for several weeks of contingency. In closing, Mr. Brugger is pleased to note that all contractors and subs are working well about providing Mike with all the needed details as well as keeping great documentation of the project as well.

### Meetings Attended

Mr. Shryock went to Columbus on Monday, August 29 to meet with the Ohio Department of Corrections in regards to additional Grant Funds for the Justice Center.
