Genesis Bond Discussion

At 9:00 a.m. Mr. Marc Kamer of Dinsmore and Shohl LLP and Mr. Mike Norman, CFO of Genesis came to speak to the Commissioners in reference to proposed bonds for the Genesis-Coshocton Facility. Genesis Healthcare System, which is a 501© 3 nonprofit corporation would like to secure revenue bonds issued by Coshocton County. in reference to bonds for their Coshocton Facility. Genesis HealthCare System constructed the Genesis Coshocton Medical Center as a 50-million-dollar project. The Genesis Coshocton Medical Center was funded through cash reserves from the System and form a loan for construction. Genesis would like to obtain permanent, longer term fixed interest rate financing for the Coshocton Medical Center that is now open. The permanent financing will repay the construction loan and reimburse Genesis for a portion of the cash reserves it spent on construction. Genesis would need to have the Commissioners approval to participate in a revenue bond financing transaction as the "conduit" bond issuer for this permanent financing. This will benefit Genesis by allowing Genesis to take advantage of "tax-exempt" interest rates, essentially lowering the cost of borrowing for Genesis. Genesis can use this interest savings to redeploy those funds that it would otherwise pay in interest costs towards its healthcare mission, which ultimately benefits those it serves, including the residents of Coshocton County. Under the proposed structure of the bond issue, the "issuer" of the bonds would be Coshocton County, and Coshocton County would provide the proceeds of the bonds to Genesis. Coshocton County has authority to undertake this bond transaction and its role as conduit "issuer" of the revenue bonds pursuant to Chapter 140 of the Ohio Revised Code. The estimated principal amount of the bonds is not expected to exceed \$25,000,000. Genesis will be solely responsible for the payment of debt services on the Bonds. As stated earlier, the taxing power and full faith credit of Coshocton County is not pledged to the bonds. No Coshocton County tax receipts and no general fund monies for Coshocton County will be used to repay the bonds. Mr. Shryock stated he is familiar with these type of bonds as the county issued

bond in the past for other larger corporations/CCMH. Mr. Shryock also informed the gentlemen of our current bonds we have for the Justice Center/EMS/Health Department Renovations. Additionally, Mr. Shryock had Mrs. Mary Beck send an email to our bond counsel to make sure this would not affect the county's ability to request more bonds in the future. Mr. Kamer stated if the Commissioners are in favor of this action, a public hearing and formal resolutions will need to be passed to enable Genesis to move forward. Mr. Kamer also stated that their will be no work on the county's end as he will coordinate and advertise for the public hearing as well as drawl up the needed resolution. Mr. Norman, CFO stated that currently the Coshocton Facility is exceeding all projections right now, to date there has been 8000 ER visits alone. Mr. Shryock appreciates what Genesis is trying to do in the community.
