2019 County Recycling Tonnage Report Increases

What a great recycling year! All 12 county recycling drop-off sites showed an increase in total pounds collected from 2018 to 2019. We appreciate your recycling efforts and hope to see an even larger increase of clean recycling in 2020. Thank YOU!

Please remember to place your recyclables loose in the bins. Do not bag recycling. Be courteous, break down cardboard boxes and place them in the "cardboard only" bins. No trash should be placed in or near the bins! Signs at each site explain what is accepted. If you have questions on what can be recycled or if a bin is full, call **740.575.4813**.

Tips for a cleaner recycling stream:

- Paper, cardboard, plastic or aluminum foil soiled with food is not recyclable.
- Pack loose paper, envelopes, etc. in a brown paper bag to recycle instead of plastic grocery bags.
- Plastic grocery bags, bread bags, dry cleaning bags, etc. can be recycled with your plastic grocery bags at participating local stores.

Erwin Family Eye Care Recycles!

Do you or someone in your household wear contacts? Don't throw your old contacts away- or the blister packs they come in! Take them to Erwin Family Eye Care on Chestnut Street to be recycled!

The Bausch + Lomb ONE by ONE Recycling Program allows used contact lenses and packaging to be recycled properly, with the goal of reducing landfill waste associated with contact lenses. Once received, the contact lenses and blister packs are separated and cleaned. The metal layers of the blister packs are recycled separately, while the contact lenses and plastic blister pack components are melted into plastic that can be remolded to make recycled products. Any brand of lenses and blister packs are accepted.
