Annual County Drop-Off Recycling Tally

Recycling tonnage was down slightly in 2021– by about 1.6% overall. However, Coshocton County drop-off locations collected over 275 tons of material in 2021.

Please remember:

- Place your recyclables loose in the bins. Do not bag recycling.
- A list of acceptable items is listed on the sign at each site– if it's not on the sign, do not put it in the bin!
- Be courteous, break down cardboard boxes and place them in the “cardboard only” bins.
- No trash should be placed in or near the bins! Signs at each site explain what is accepted.

If you have questions on what can be recycled or if a bin is full, call **740.575.4813**.

Tips for a cleaner recycling stream:

- Paper, cardboard, plastic or aluminum foil soiled with food is not recyclable.
- Remove and discard packing materials from cardboard boxes before breaking them down for recycling.
- “To-go” cups, lids and straws are NOT recyclable, neither is Styrofoam.
