182 in Attendance at 79th Annual Meeting and Banquet



The Coshocton Soil and Water Conservation District held their 80th Annual Banquet at Lake Park Pavilion Thursday evening, October 20, 2022. 182 area residents and special guests were in attendance. A buffet dinner was served by Theo's Restaurant of Cambridge preceding the meeting.

The evening's entertainment was the Land of Legend 4 Chorus, which is part of the larger Land of Legend Chorus who perform regionally at barbershop singing competitions. The Land of Legend Chorus is made up of 20 members who are part of the Barbershop Harmony Society. The group was formed in 1950 and have sang all over North America. Matt Hopper, Paul Russell, Billy Edwards, and Mike Sitter made up the quartet that sang a collection of upbeat acapella songs that were enjoyed by the crowd.

Coshocton Soil and Water Conservation District announced the 2022 Outstanding Conservation Farmer of the Year Award which went to the Travis Gregorich family. The Gregorich farm consists of 118 acres and is located in

Washington Township. The Gregorich family raises 60 pairs of commercial cattle on 200 acres of pasture. They also make about 50 acres of hay, which allows them to run on grass for about 8 months of the year. Conservation practices installed on the Gregorich farm include 4 spring developments with 7 watering facilities, 2,282 ft. of pipeline, 790 ft. of access road, a heavy use pad, 12,611 ft. of fence, 13.8 acres of cropland conversion to pasture, 81.3 acres of prescribed grazing, and 5.9 acres of brush management. The Gregorich farm hosted a Pasture Walk and SWCD Conservation Tour in 2019. Travis and Jenna hold off-farm jobs relating to agriculture, are long time Coshocton County Farm Bureau members, and Jenna serves as a Farm Bureau Foundation board member. Travis represents Washington Township on the Republican Central Committee. Travis and Jenna moved to Coshocton County in 2010 and have one daughter, Vera, who is in second grade at Tri-Valley. Congratulations to Travis and Jenna Gregorich on being named the 2022 Outstanding Conservation Farm of the Year. *(continued on the next page)*

Sharon & John Hill own the 2022 winning Big Tree, a Red Oak.


Dennis Lowery which measured 178" in circumference with a vertical height of 82' and an average crown spread of 85' with a total of 282 points.

Cover Crops in Coshocton County

County producers signed up over 4,997 acres of cover crops for the Muskingum Watershed Conservancy District Cover Crop Program. Cost share funds for approved fields amounted to over \$44,772 for Coshocton County producers. About 31% of the acres were flown by Fishers Ag Service in early September into standing soybeans and corn; 35% was broadcast and 34% was drilled after harvest was completed. The purpose of the program is to provide a growing cover over the winter months to minimize soil erosion, increase soil organic matter, improve water infiltration, and improve water quality.
