



Career Opportunity: *Stormwater Technician*

This is an opportunity to make a difference for water quality and the environment in Coshocton County. Technician will assist the City of Coshocton with OEPA Small MS4 compliance and requirements, as well as assist businesses to comply with stormwater permits.

The Stormwater Technician is an employee of the Coshocton Soil and Water Conservation District and is ultimately responsible to the Coshocton SWCD Board of Supervisors.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Development of educational resources and events for contractors, community members, and other stakeholders.
- Collect in-field data of storm sewer structures, household sewage treatment systems, and other features as assigned.
- Conduct dry weather screenings of outfalls.
- Conduct inspections of active construction sites and post construction facilities to ensure compliance with approved plans and regulations.
- Assist with pollution prevention and good housekeeping trainings and inspections.
- Assist with District programs.

Skills and Qualifications:

- A minimum of an associate degree in a natural resources, engineering, or related field, or equivalent professional experience.
- Knowledge of all 6 MCMs (Minimum Control Measures) and required activities to maintain compliance with the OEPA Small MS4 permit
- Experience with ESRI products and able to interpret maps, site plans and aerial photography.
- Able to traverse rough terrain and lift to 20 pounds.
- Self-motivated and able to work alone with attention to detail, yet appreciate working in a team atmosphere.
- Positive attitude and good public relation skills.
- Able to operate field equipment (GPS data collector/ tablet, and mobile phone).
- Have a valid Ohio driver's license with a good driving record.
- Able to pass a background check.
- Proficient with Microsoft Office programs and willingness to learn new applications.
