At 12:00 p.m. Mr. Fischer moved the meeting to recess. At 1:00 p.m. Mr. Shryock returned the meeting to regular session. Mr. Fischer left the meeting to attend Board of Revision Hearing.

ODOT Projects

Mr. Joe Rutheford, Assistant Director of ODOT, Ms. Julie Gwinn, Highway Management Administrator, Bill Sullivan, Coshocton County Manager, Mr. Jerry Stenner, City of Coshocton

and Mr. Fred Wachtel attended the meeting to discuss Coshocton County ODOT Projects. Mr. Rutheford introduced his staff that he brought with him and went over the area that is covered by ODOT District 5. He stated that they are responsible for all highways in that area outside city limits. The district covers over 3500 miles of roadway which is 8.75% of the total miles of road that ODOT is responsible for throughout the state. In 2010 ODOT did 2.093 billion dollars in projects over the whole State. In District 5, 64.06 million dollars of which is 3.7% of the total spent in the State. In 2011 District 5 will get 63.3 million for projects. The total monies being distributed throughout the state continues to decrease. However, District 5 continues to remain pretty steady. In 2011 District 5 has awarded or will award 47 projects. The current estimates for these projects are 77.8 million. Of those projects 24 are resurfacing, 12 are bridge and 11 safety which includes maintenance projects like guardrail, striping, ect. Their goal is to balance general pavement and bridge conditions throughout the state. In Coshocton County they have one project which is a bridge replacement. The reason for this is that the State road conditions in Coshocton County are in very good condition. In 2012 Coshocton County has one project as well. He then stated that there is district-wide maintenance done each year in all the counties of District 5. Mr. Shryock asked about SR 715 being chip and sealed last year. What is the reasoning behind doing this? Mr. Sullivan stated that it was just something the State was trying last year that did not work to well because of the flooding. Ms. Gwinn stated that chip seal was tried to see if they could save monies and it started a couple years ago. Mr. Wachtel asked if there have been any changes in the salt buying contract for the state. Mr. Rutheford stated that he has not heard of anything about that at this time. Mr. Wachtel asked about the Columbus/Pittsburgh Corridor. Mr. Rutheford stated that the monies are just not available for this project. Mr. Wachtel then asked several general questions about state processes and how they will be continued. Mr. Jerry Stenner stated that last year they did work with ODOT on paving the South Second Street area and it was a great working relationship. He asked when he has questions about putting traffic lights around school areas can they help him answer these questions. Mr. Rutheford stated that they will try to help when they can in pointing him in the right direction or answer some of his questions, but they really cannot compete with the private sector on that. He stated that the Ohio Revised Code states when a signal is warranted. The Commissioners thanked them for attending.
