Vorys Advisors - Demands/Challenges - Oil Fracking

Mr. Zach Space, Vorys Advisors attended the meeting to have some discussion with the Commissioners about the demands and challenges of oil and gas fracking. He stated that he is working for Vorys Advisors in governmental affairs. One thing he has been focusing on is the oil and gas fracking in the area. He stated that Vorys Advisors does have a very strong energy section. He feels that we will not see anything like this again in our lifetime. He feels this is a positive development, but one we should be cautious about. This area has been plagued with economic issues for years and this could help tremendously. The reason he is here today is in hopes that he can be of assistance to the county. He explained there is a tax that the county's will receive that will pay the county between \$25,000 and \$35,000 per well per year. A significant portion of that tax will go to the schools. He stated that the county can utilize these monies to help increase infrastructure by bonding the funds coming in and taking those monies to build the infrastructure such as water and sewer, roads and bridges. He is requesting to consider Voyers Advisors for their bond counseling. He hopes the Commissioners will be receptive to talking with them about this issue. Mr. Shryock stated that we have used Joseph Robertson and Matt Stout, Bricker and Eckler as our bond counsel previously, but that is not to say we won't consider sitting down with them and discuss this. He stated that another thing these oil companies are interested in is becoming involved in some charitable foundations in the area and we should be looking at this. Mr. Shryock thanked him for attending and stated that the Commissioners will discuss this possibility and get back with him.
