Mr. Joe Rutherford - ODOT

Mr. Joe Rutherford, ODOT, Mr. Bill Sullivan, Coshocton County ODOT Manager and Mr. Andrew Jones, Coshocton County Engineer's Office attended the meeting to discuss the Coshocton Kickoff. Mr. Rutherford reviewed the 52 projects planned throughout the 5th District in the State of Ohio. He explained that District 5 is a seven county area consisting of 3,731 lane miles of roadway and 1,082 bridges. He went over the District 5 points of contact. He stated that ODOT itself is responsible for over 50,000 miles of roadway. District 5 has 7.6% of all the lane miles in the State. In fiscal year 2011 District 5 spent \$68 million dollars in projects. This is 3.7% of the total ODOT monies available. In fiscal year 2012, District 5 is projected \$92.9 million dollars in projects. This is 8.1% of the total statewide. In the coming fiscal year 2013, District 5 is projecting \$58.6 million dollars which represents 3.2% of the statewide spending. This summer, District 5 will have approximately 75 projects for an estimated total of \$84.4 million dollars. The current estimated local let is \$8.5 million dollars. He stated that bids have been coming in approximately 10% higher than in previous years. He feels this is due to the fuel and material cost increases. He feels the projects that will be let this year allows for contractors of all sizes to bid. They break down their spending on three areas, resurfacing, bridges and general repair. In Coshocton County they will be resurfacing SR 93 to the Tuscarawas County line at a cost of 2.9 million dollars. This project should start in July or August. They will also replace 2 bridges between Coshocton and Plainfield at a cost of \$323 thousand dollars. They will Upgrade the signals on US 36 north of Coshocton and restripe all ODOT routes and make various guardrail repairs/improvements throughout the county. He thanked the County Engineer, Fred Wachtel for coordinating upcoming CEAO projects among multiple counties. This helps get better pricing for everyone. Mr. Shryock asked several questions pertaining to work being done in the county. Mr. Sullivan explained some of the general repair projects going on in the county at this time. The Commissioners thanked them for attending.
