### Executive Session - Personnel - EMA

At 10:00 a.m. Mr. Lee made a motion, seconded by Mr. Fischer to go into executive session with Mr. James Vanhorn to discuss personnel hiring, firing, compensation or discipline. All vote aye. At 10:32 a.m. the meeting was returned to regular session. No action taken.

### Discussion - Mr. Tim Mulford

Mr. Tim Mulford and Mr. Daniel Kurczi attended the meeting to discuss with the Commissioners the possibility of them amending our Road Maintenance Agreements with the oil companies to make it mandatory for the oil companies to utilize prevailing wage. Mr. Kurczi explained the necessity for this amendment. Mr. Lee asked how many counties have done this. He stated that Mahoning County is already on board and they are working with several other counties to move in this direction. Mr. Shryock asked how many other Commissioners Offices have they spoken to about this subject. Mr. Kurczi stated that they have spoken to 6 other counties to date. He stated that so far everyone has been very receptive. Mr. Mulford stated that this will not cost the tax payer a dime, but will require the contractor to utilize more local workers. Mr. Kurczi stated that the roadwork being done at this time requires the use of prevailing wage and he feels this should be the same as when the county does roadwork. They are required to utilize prevailing wage. Mr. Lee asked how they get by without paying prevailing wage. Mr. Kurczi stated that since there is nothing in the agreement that requires them to do so, they do not have to pay their employees prevailing wage. Mr. Fischer asked what will require them to bid the job out. Mr. Kurczi stated that they send out invitations to certain companies to bid on a project. The Commissioners thanked them for attending and stated that we will forward this information to the County Prosecutor for his review before making a final determination.
