2nd Public Hearing 2013 CDBG Programs

At 10:00 a.m. the 2nd Public Hearing for the 2013 CDBG Programs was opened. Mr. John Cleek, CDC of Ohio, Mr. Dave Kadri, West Lafayette Village Administrator and Mrs. Robin Schonauer were in attendance. Mr. Cleek reviewed all the CDBG Programs that the County is applying for. He stated that CDC is representing Coshocton County for the 2013 CDBG Community Block Program. He stated that the Allocation Program has been dramatically cut throughout the state. He stated that they are moving to more competitive programming. He explained that the County has applied for the maximum amount allowable for the competitive program as well as the Allocation program. He reviewed the Allocation Program projects. He stated that the City of Coshocton is included in our program this year. They have submitted a sidewalk improvement project for the City and the second project is with the Village of West Lafayette and it is for Fire Protection Facilities. He then moved on to the Neighborhood Revitalization Program. The County is applying for the maximum amount for the following projects: Fire Protection Facilities and Equipments, Parks and Recreation Facilities and Street Improvements. He stated that we are applying for the Village of West Lafayette and Lafayette Township on the Critical Infrastructure Program, for new infrastructure to install 4200 linear feet of 10 inch water line to Lafayette Meadows, Gentle Brook which is a Developmental Disability Facility. Mr. Cleek state that the grant applications are due this Friday. That being all, Mr. Lee closed the public hearing at 10:24 a.m.

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Mr. Jeff Wherley – Disposal Update

Mr. Jeff Wherley attended the meeting to give the Commissioners an update on the recycling disposal issue. Mr. Wherley stated that he visited Rumpke and had a good meeting. He told them at the very least he would like to be able to drop our recycling at Mt. Vernon. Rumpke stated that this would be fine with them. Mr. Wherley stated that they could start this on a trial basis anytime. However, when he contacted Mt. Vernon they were not aware of the meeting he had with Rumpke in Columbus, he is talking with the Columbus Office and they will get back with him very soon. Mr. Wherley also talked with J & J Recycling and he is waiting to hear back from them. He stated that we are still up in the air on this, but he feels we will be able to continue our program. He stated that he would like to move our program to single stream recycling as it is much more efficient. He stated that the program in place now is more time consuming and if we could go to the roll-offs, we could really expand our program. Mr. Shryock asked Mr. Wherley to put a request in letter form to get these roll-offs from the CFLP. The Commissioners then asked Mr. Wherley to contact Rumpke again and get something in writing from them stating that they are willing to take our waste stream for at least 3 months. So that we might be able to acquire the roll-off's by that time. The Commissioners thanked him for attending.
