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Discussion – 911 Fire Dispatch

Sheriff Timothy Rogers, Lt. Dean Hettinger, Lt. James Crawford and Mr. Jon Mosier attended the meeting to discuss the dispatching of the 911 fire. Mr. Lee stated that we have been getting a lot of questions from the fire departments and wanted to clarify them with the Sheriff. Mr. Lee then stated that we want to make certain that since we are going to the MARCS System, the Sheriff will still dispatch the Fire off the old system. Mr. Mosier stated that we intend to keep some of the towers up to be able to do this. The biggest problem at this time is the fact that MARCS does not have a paging system and won't have one in place until approximately 2015. So we will need to keep the old system in place for a few more years at least. Mr. Lee asked who pays for the radio system for the fire. Mr. Mosier stated that the system maintenance and service has been paid for out of the 911 funds. Mr. Shryock asked long term, what the maintenance costs for the system will be. Mr. Mosier stated that the Roscoe base station is fairly new, OSU is in pretty good shape, but the links from the Sheriff's Office to OSU and then on the Warsaw has never been narrow banded and this needs to be done. This may cost approximately \$10,000. EMA got a grant for equipment at Bakersville and we are trying to determine if the county has given them that equipment. Sheriff Rogers asked if they are able to apply for a grant for the MARCS radios, and then utilize our system for the paging only. Mr. Mosier stated that they can go to MARCS for their fire system and use the pagers that they have in place at this time. The Commissioners thanked them for attending and their information.

EMS Compensation

Mr. Todd Shroyer attended the meeting to discuss some EMS Compensation. General conversation then followed.
