Roth IRA's - Mr. Michael Sierwaski

Mr. Michael Sierwaski, ICMA Retirement Corporation attended the meeting to request the ability to go into County Departments to offer Roth IRA's. Mr. Sierwaski explained his company and stated that ICMA and ICMRA are non-profits located in Washington DC. He stated that they offer a 457 plan and the Roth IRA. The Roth is an alternative to the 457 plan. The Roth IRA can be placed in an account and if left there for 5 years then withdrawn after age 59 ½ then the monies are tax free. If you take the monies out prior to turning age 59 ½ and being in the account for 5 years, then the funds have already been taxed but you still can utilize these funds. Also with a Roth IRA, individuals are not required to take any monies out once they reach age 70 ½ as in other Retirement Funds. The minimum amount for the employee to contribute is \$10 per pay. The Commissioners stated that they will grant him authorization to contact the county departments to get this information to them.

2016-2017 CORSA Renewal

Mr. Don Parkhill, Jacobs Vannaman Insurance Company, Ms. Jinny Shrimplin, CORSA and Mrs. Tiffany Swigert, Coshocton County Safety and Loss Control attended the meeting to present the 2016-2017 CORSA Renewal. Mr. Parkhill stated that it is all good news today. He stated that the equity is up again this year and that brings our premiums down. Ms. Shrimplin then reviewed the program. She stated that every county received a decrease in their premiums this year. The county received several discounts this year as well as the program costs was down this year. The County received a 100% discount on the Loss Control Incentive Program which was \$8,851 in credits. Ms. Shrimplin then stated that there are some new coverages that are being included this year and they include Cyber Liability and Medical Professional Liability and Drone Coverage. She then stated that they intend to start doing IT Vulnerability Testing that will help determine if our system is vulnerable to outside intrusion. Ms. Shrimplin then reviewed some Risk Management items for the Law Enforcement and they are providing \$300 toward each body cameral per sworn road patrol personnel and a Software Platform for Law Enforcement as well. She then reviewed the CORSA Stewardship Report. Mr. Parkhill requested that CORSA give the Commissioners a quote to increase the liability limits from \$6 million to \$10 million. The Commissioners thanked them for attending.

Discussion - Jason Given, County Prosecutor

Mr. Jason Given, Coshocton County Prosecutor stopped in to answer a couple questions the Commissioners had about the legalities and possibility of the sale of the Hydrologic Station Property. General discussion then followed.
