Discussion – Commercial Recycling

Mr. Jeff Wherley attended the meeting at the request of the Commissioners to discuss where we are on the Commercial Recycling. Mr. Wherley stated that Waste Parchment is willing to supply bins, but they need a dry place to put the bins to keep the cardboard dry. He stated that Lity's might be an option, but the Commissioners weren't certain people would go down a long lane to get rid of it. He stated that an option might be to get monies from the Solid Waste District to build some type of three sided barn that we could place the bins in. The Commissioners are concerned about the size of the bins and people bringing in cardboard too large for the bins. Mr. Shryock stated that he has been approached by some residents about their concern of not having any option as far as the industrial recycling. Mr. Wherley stated that the industrial recycling is done in house in many of the companies in Coshocton. Mr. Shryock stated that we have not given smaller businesses much of an option in this situation. Mr. Wherley stated that he has talked with Lity and some shipping brokers about this issue and it would run them too much in the red to do this type of business. Mr. Shryock stated that he was informed that Buehler's compact their cardboard and a company comes in and gets it for \$30 per ton. If we were to supply the compactor and building, would a company be interested in doing this. Mr. Wherley stated that he could check to see if there would be any interest in this. Mr. Shryock stated that he would like to have Mr. Wherley return in a week to give an update of his findings on this issue. The Commissioners stated that they will talk with him next week.

Discussion – Exterior Building Work – Tremco, Inc.

Mr. Mark Wearstler, and Mr. Kevin Butler, Tremco, Inc. attended the meeting to talk with the Commissioners about their company and what they can offer. Mr. Wearstler stated that they are a manufacturer of roofing repairs and total building restorations as well. The company has been in business since 1928. They would like to take a look at a building that we have to see if they can help the county out. They specialize in the long term and can help the Commissioners with planning for maintenance and repairs to buildings. They like to take a proactive approach to buildings. Mr. Shryock asked if they work for counties. Mr. Butler stated that they mostly work with schools. The Commissioners thanked them for attending and stated that they will be glad to look at their portfolio.
