Executive Session – Personnel Compensation

Public Hearing – FY 2016 Allocations

Mr. John Cleek, CDC of Ohio and Mrs. Robin Schonauer attended the Public Hearing. This public hearing is to re-allocate funds that were to be used for a project in the City of Coshocton that was not funded through the State of Ohio CDBG Critical Infrastructure Grant. The funds will be divided between Street Improvements in the amount of \$29,800, and 2 Clearance/Demolition Projects in the amount of \$16,000 and \$14,200 respectively. That being all, Mr. Lee closed the public hearing.

Metropolitan Housing - Environmental Review

Mr. Cliff Biggers and Attorney Todd Drown attended the meeting to discuss Metropolitan Housing's Annual Environmental Review. Mr. Biggers stated that he is Chairman of the Board of Metropolitan Housing and he said that 86% of the revenue comes from Housing and Urban Development (HUD). He stated that they are working on the Review at this time and Mr. Darr,

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their Director stated that it was going to cost between \$5,000 to \$8,000 to get this review completed. Mr. Lee stated that the figure that we were given by CDC of Ohio (the company doing the review for them at this time) was between \$200 and \$400. Mr. Biggers stated that they will clarify that cost with Mr. Darr. Mr. Drown asked if the figure is as high as 5-8 thousand dollars would the Commissioners have an issue with Metropolitan Housing asking Mr. Dale Hartle to do the work for them. The Commissioners stated that they are not certain where this other figure came from, but if the cost is \$200 - \$400 they see no reason to change. However, if the Metropolitan Housing Board would choose to utilize another agency they have no issue with that. Mr. Biggers stated that they will look into this and get back with the Commissioners about what they would like to do. The Commissioners thanked them for attending.

Courthouse Weathervane

Mr. Brad Birkhimer, Blacksmith attended the meeting to present the Commissioners with some options for a weathervane on the bell tower at the Common Pleas Courthouse. He presented the Commissioners with different options of what could be up there and the cost. He also stated that he can leave a book and let the Commissioners look it over to see if there is any design that they would prefer. Mr. Birkhimer stated that the cost for his design will be \$600 and that will include installation. The Commissioners stated that they like his proposal and would like him to start work as soon as possible. Mr. Birkhimer stated that he can have the weathervane made and installed by Thanksgiving. The Commissioners thanked him for attending.
