Justice Center - Body Scanner

Sheriff Timothy Rogers, Lt. Chip Udischas, Lt. Jim Crawford and Lt. Dean Hettinger attended the meeting to discuss the purchase of a Body Scanner for the Justice Center. Lt. Udischas presented the request for the body scanner and explained the necessity for having one in our Justice Center. He reviewed the number of drug overdoses in justice centers throughout the State of Ohio. He explained how the scanner works and the images that will appear. He then discussed other counties that have this product and their recommendations for it. He discussed the amount of radiation that is present when scanning. It is about as much as in eating a banana and much less than have a scan of your teeth at the dentist. They would like to purchase the scanner from OD Securities. They are on our State Contracting List and the scanner can be installed within 30 days. The cost of the machine is \$118,750.00. This is approximately \$100,000 less than their competitors. He explained that there are leasing options, and also explained the software and updates. He reviewed the life

expectancy for the machine which is 10-12 years. He stated that the machine can be moved if necessary. He feels this is a necessity for the Coshocton Justice Center. He stated that there are 2 options for the placement of this scanner. One is to add on to the building which would be an additional cost of \$22,000 to \$30,000. Another option would be to utilize a hallway and block off I-block. At this time they utilize it for both male and female. If they shut off this hallway, they will only be able to use I-block for females. Lt. Crawford stated that Pat Kelly, Architect was down to look at the facility and he determined that they would need an additional 12x14 addition built on. The Sheriff stated that they have seen an increase in contraband being brought in to the facility. Not any more than any other facility, however, it is happening. That being all, the Commissioners stated that they will review everything and get back with them as soon as possible. They thanked them for their presentation.
