# Board of Elections-Voting Machines

Ms. Stephanie Slifko and Ms. Kirsten Ross attended the meeting to update the Commissioners on new voting machines. Ms. Ross stated the Secretary of State asked them to meet with their County Commissioners to discuss the county's need for new voting equipment. The State currently has \$7 million appropriated to reimburse Counties. In addition, they are looking to put more funding in the budget to assist the needs of counties. The current reimbursement suggestion is at an 85-15 split. The maximum reimbursement is up to \$250,000 per county. The State would like to hear back from the Board of Elections on how much it would cost to upgrade. Ms. Slifko has received a list of equipment vendors and has priced several machines. They have narrowed their search down to three different vendors. The cost would be around \$550,000-\$600,000, she is exploring trade in options and leasing options for a 10-year period. The new machines come with a support for up to three elections. The States goal is to have all of Ohio counties voting machines upgraded before the next Presidential election. Ms. Ross said that they have visited several surrounding counties that are using the machines they are interested in so that has been helpful in their search. Ms. Slifko would like to have each of the machines demonstrated in their office in the next few months and invited the Commissioners to attend. Mr. Fischer thanked them for attending.

First Addendum Jobs and Commerce Economic Development Agreement

Mr. Lee made a motion, second by Mr. Fischer to sign the First Addendum to the Jobs and Commerce Economic Development Agreement to delete the last sentence in Section 2.4 entirely and replaced by the following: 2.4- The deadline for the final reimbursement request is December 29, 2107, b. All other terms in the original Agreement signed July 22, 2016 are still enforced, as requested by Mrs. Dorothy Skowrunski, Port Authority Director.
