He then presented the deed of the Old Stone Fort to the Commissioners. He stated that it is deeded to the Coshocton County Historical Society. There will need to be research done to determine who is in succession to that now as the Coshocton County Historical Society no longer exits. Mr. Wachtel then discussed Circle Drive. He stated that everyone that lives on this road has an address of Sheridan Drive. In the Engineer's data base, they have Boulevard Circle as an also known as address. He would like to meet with the Sheriff's Office and the EMS to determine where they are getting their information on the addressing as the EMS was dispatched to Circle Drive and not Sheridan Road. The Commissioners wondered if the 911 caller called the road Circle Drive and that is why it was dispatched that way. Mr. Wachtel stated that he will notify the Commissioners when he has confirmed a meeting date if they would like to attend as well. Mr. Wachtel stated that ODOT is planning to pour the river bridge next Tuesday, and the bridge will be closed completely for five days. The Commissioners thanked Mr. Wachtel for attending.

Justice Center Roof/Progress Center Roof

Mr. Dennis Lowe, Consultant, Mrs. Robin Schonauer, Budget Director and Mr. Ike Reger, Maintenance Supervisor attended the meeting to discuss the need to replace the Justice Center Roof as well as the Progress Center Roof. Mr. Shryock stated the Commissioners requested that Mr. Lowe attend to talk about replacing the roofs on the Justice Center as well as the Progress Center. The Justice Center roof is 46 years old and has a leak that they are unable to fix. We had a roof failure there last week. It has been temporarily fixed, but we do have additional leaks. This building is in desperate need of a new roof. They would like Mr. Lowes opinion on the necessity of an architect on this project. Also, the Progress Center roof is a shingled roof and they feel this will be the lessor of the costs for these replacements. Mr. Lowe stated that he feels that it is really important to have an architect on the project from the beginning. He feels that they will take care of many of the issues that arise in a project. He stated that he feels he is the go between with the architect to make certain everything is proceeding as it should. Mr. Fischer stated that he feels Mr. Lowe is our eyes on the project and has the expertise to make certain everything is being done correctly. Mr. Lowe feels that we should have an architect for both projects. The Commissioners asked Mr. Lowe if he would be willing to help us select an architect. Mr. Lowe stated that he would do this. He feels if they want to do these projects next spring, we need to get started on the selection now. The Commissioners are in agreement and thanked him for attending.
