Discussion

Mr. James McDonald, President and CEO of Allwell attended the meeting to give the Commissioners an update on their new building project. Mr. McDonald gave them a background of Allwell in our community and discussed the new facility that will be located at 710 Main Street, Coshocton. The building will be 9,500 square feet and will cost approximately \$3.2 million. They have signed a loan with the USDA and the Ohio Department of Addiction Services will provide some funding. The contractor will be Paul Construction Company, Inc. Their target date for opening will be in June 2020. A groundbreaking ceremony will be Thursday, September 19, 2019 @ 4 p.m.

Kirk Drain Project

Ms. Deb Bigelow, Mr. Ryan Medley Mr. Zach Wallace and Mr. Greg Waters from the Soil and Water Conservation District attended the meeting to discuss the Kirk Drain Project. Ms. Bigelow explained that according to Amy Boyer, ODA Engineer, the SWCD Technicians could move forward with the survey and design as a Petition Ditch or Conservation Works of Improvement but they do not have job approval for the project. Ms. Boyer could assist since she has job approval for these types of improvements. If Ryan Medley and Zach Wallace do the survey and design work, it would save the County money. Soil and Water would like to move forward with the survey and design work on the Kirk Drain, she has spoken with Fred Wachtel, County Engineer and he agrees. Mr. Shryock asked how many properties the improvement affected. Ryan Medley stated there are six residents currently affected by the work needed on the ditch. Soil and Water will get permission from the homeowners regarding the surveys. Mr. Lee asked if they needed additional funding, Ms. Bigelow stated they did not come seeking additional funds, SWCD just wanted to keep the Commissioner informed of the project. The Commissioners agreed that the project needed to move forward.
