Public Hearing – 2020 CDBG Programs

At 10:00 a.m. Mr. Fischer opened the public hearing for the 2020 CDBG Programs. Ms. Hannah Diewald, CDC of Ohio and Mr. Tom Barcroft attended the hearing. Ms. Diewald reviewed the qualifying reasons for CDBG Funds: Low to Moderate Income (LMI), Elimination of Slum and Blight and limited Clientele. She then reviewed the CDBG Programs: Allocation, is funding for the county to receive this year to undertake eligible infrastructure, public facility, and public service and planning activities. She reviewed the different competitive grant opportunities which are, Neighborhood Revitalization, Downtown Revitalization, Critical Infrastructure, Residential Public Infrastructure, Economic Development and Fair Housing (which is not competitive). She explained each grant opportunity and requirements. There was discussion about the Downtown Revitalization Grant opportunities and how this might work for Coshocton. The county will prioritize projects and select projects for Program year 2020 application. Projects will be rated based on criticality, feasibility and need. She also reviewed some of the grants that the county has in place now and how this will affect our ability to apply for certain grant funding as you can only have so many grants open in a year. General discussion about projects and qualifications continued. The Commissioners thanked everyone for attending. Mr. Fischer closed the public hearing at 10: 36 a.m..
