Public Hearing – Vacation Jefferson Twp./Harrington/Alleyways- Terri & Michael Phillabaum

At 10:00 a.m. Mr. Fischer opened the Public Hearing for the vacation of the Jefferson Twp./Harrington/Alleyways request by Terri & Michael Phillabaum. In attendance was Mr. Jason Given, Prosecutor, Mr. Michael Phillabaum, Mr. Chris Cullison and Elisbete de Sousa. Mr. Fischer asked if Mr. Phillabaum would still like to continue as he submitted the petition. Mr. Phillibaum stated yes. Then Mr. Cullison stated that they are not in favor of closing the 16' alley in the back part of the property. Mr. Fischer asked if the alley he was referencing not to close was the 16'alley that joins his property. Mr. Cullison said that was correct. Mr. Given stated that when an alley is vacated that both parties would gain property to the center line. Mr. Given stated that there 2 different references to vacating an alley inside a subdivision vs. an alley outside a subdivision. An alley that is inside a subdivision means that it is dedicated to the subdivision, no one owns the dirt under the road. For an alley outside a subdivision residents own the dirt under the road. A Supreme Court case states that if there is an alley you go to the center of road to divide the property even if one is outside the subdivision. In this case the alley in question, no one owns the dirt. Mr. Fischer stated that since no one owns the 16' feet alley and if the Commissioners decide to vacate this alley then each property owner will gain 8' feet of property. Mr. Fischer asked the Cullisons if their wish was still not to vacate the 16' foot alley the joins their property. The Cullisons said yes they would like this to remain open in case they would subdivide their property in the future. Mr. Fischer asked for clarification that they did agree to the vacation of all the other alleys but not the 16'foot alley that joined his property. The Cullisons agreed. Mr. Fischer asked if anyone had any closing comments. Mr. Phillabaum stated that they would like to see them all closed. Mr. Fischer stated the Commissioners would take this information under advisement and get back with everyone next week. He thanked everyone for attending.
