Executive Session – Opioid Litigation Update

At 9:00 a.m. Mr. Fischer made a motion, seconded by Mr. Conkle to get an update on the Opioid Litigation. All vote aye. At 9:10 a.m. Mr. Shryock returned the meeting to regular session. No action taken.

Coshoctonians for Peace and Equality Zoom Presentation

Ms. Lucy Malenke and Ms. Javanna Ramsey attended the meeting via Zoom to present the Henry Howard Story. Ms. Malenke gave a brief history about herself. Ms. Ramsey then gave a brief history of herself as well. She explained how Coshoctonians for Peace and Equality started and what their mission is. Ms. Malenke then gave a brief review of the history of race relations in Coshocton. She then began the story of Henry Howard a man who was lynched in 1885. They feel this is an important story to tell as they feel if we know our history it will help us understand where we are today. She then discussed the Equal Justice Initiative's Community Remembrance Project. This is a project that document racial violent throughout history to foster meaningful dialogue about race and justice today. Ms. Malenke then talked about all the different entities they have shared their story with to date. Ms. Ramsey stated that they are requesting a Historical Marker at the Courthouse, and exhibit at the Johnson-Humrickhouse Museum and several Community events. Ms. Malenke asked what the process or next step is to getting a Historical Marker on the Court Square. Mr. Shryock thanked them for their presentation. He asked who will fund the marker and Ms. Malenke stated the Equal Justice Initiative will fund the marker. Mr. Fischer asked who does the research about what will be on the marker. Ms. Malenke stated that they will work in collaboration with the Equal Justice Initiative to come up with what will be on the marker. Mr. Fischer stated that he feels that the Commissioners would like a final draft of the marker to review prior to placing the marker. Mr. Shryock asked if they have a place in mind to set the marker. Ms. Ramsey stated that she does not and Ms. Malenke agreed that she does not either. They are open to what the Commissioners suggest. Mr. Shryock stated that he is in agreement with the historical marker as well. Mr. Conkle stated he is also in agreement with the marker. Ms. Malenke and Ms. Ramsey stated that they will continue to work with the Equal Justice Initiative to come up with language and then get that to the Commissioners. The Commissioners thanked them again for their presentation.
