Public Hearing-TR 441 Road Vacation

At 9 am, Mr. Shryock opened the public hearing for Township Road 441 in Virginia Township. Being all of abandoned portion of TR 441 located on property of Troy E. Spang and Jennifer K. Spang and being at the end of the maintained portion of TR 441, approximately 740 feet, north and ending at the Virginia/Jackson township line.

Present for the public hearing was Mr. Terry Cox, Mr. Troy Spang, Mr. Ralph Zacharyasz, Mr. Joshua Kempf, Assistant County Engineer, Mr. Dane Shryock, Mr. Gary Fischer, Mrs. Mary Beck, County Administrator and Mrs. Brooke Alverson, Clerk. Mr. Shryock opened up the floor for discussion and asked Mr. Spang if he had any information he would like to share in regards to this petition. Mr. Spang stated he had no additional information to share, as all the information is in the file. Mr. Spang stated that he believes he has asked the right questions for this process and he states that it is plain to see from the property lines that he is not asking to take property away from anyone else. Mr. Cox stated he is not in favor of this road vacation as it would affect his property use. There is in question whose survey most accurately depicts the correct property lines, Mr. Spang or Mr. Cox. Mr. Shryock spoke to Mr. Cox about his ability to have a private road subdivision into his property and how those road standards would be lesser than if he ever wanted to bring the current road in question up to current standards. Mr. Cox doubts he will ever open the road but is not 100% sure as to what may happen in time. Mr. Shryock questioned if all road sizes are 60 feet and Mr. Kempf stated that this statement is true. Mr. Zacharyasz said the road has not been used in over 100 years, and would like it vacated as well. He believes that Mr. Cox has access to his property needed. Mr. Kempf stated it is the County Engineer's stance to vacate the road as it serves no public needs. A permanent easement would remain for utilities and so forth that would never go away even if road is vacated. Mr. Shryock let everyone know that he has a meeting later today with Mr. Jason Given, County Prosecutor to ask some additional questions on this vacation, and he also stated he wants to talk to both sets of township trustees to ask why they do not want the road vacated. In closing everyone present today will be notified by phone as to when the notice of determination will be made on this road vacation petition.

2023 Budget

At 10 am, Mrs. Robin Schonauer, Budget Director presented the Commissioners with the 2023 Budget. The total 2022 carryover was \$3,676,935, minus the Purchase Orders of \$879,300, that leaves the available carryover at \$2,797,634. Anticipated Revenue is \$13,400,233, which then will leave a total available to appropriate of \$16,197,867. The General Fund will set a budget of \$15,730,792 for the 2023 calendar year and the Non-general fund budget was set at \$58,328,708, giving a grand total for the calendar year of 2023 of \$74,059,500 for the County Budget. The 2023 budget is set lower than the 2022 was by \$136,406. Mr., Shryock thanked Mrs. Schonauer for all of her work and efforts in regards to setting the budget.
