2023 County Wide Mowing-Bid Opening (Engineers Office)

At 9:00 a.m. the bids for the Coshocton County Wide Mowing Contract were opened with the following persons in attendance: Mr. Josh Kempf, Assistant County Engineer, Mr. Rod Tennant, Quick Mow Inc, Mr. Jon Tennant, Quick Mow Inc, Mr. Louis Crider, Quick Mow Inc., Mr. Tyler Gandee, Running G Farms & Construction. Mr. Conkle read the following bids aloud: Meyer All terrain Mowing LLC with a bid of \$116,424.00, Quick Mow Inc with a bid of \$159,489.00 and Running G Farms & Construction-no bond sheet attached, therefor the bid was no accepted. The Engineers estimate was \$165,000.00. The bids were turned over to the Engineer's office for review and recommendation. for mowing.

2022 Coshocton County Engineers Report

Mr. Frederick T. Wachtel, Coshocton County Engineer presented his 2022 Engineers Report. The Engineers office had zero safety reportable incidents for 2022. The following County Roads were resurfaced in 2022: CR 10 with 3.02 miles of asphalt, CR 24 with 1.47 of asphalt, Otsego Ave with 0.92 miles of asphalt, CR 318 with 0.66 miles of asphalt, CR 501 with 0.62 miles of asphalt, CR 14 with 1.47 miles of asphalt, CR 343 with 1.78 miles of motorpave, CR 319 with 0.76 miles of FDR and single seal, CR 33 with 3.28 miles of double seal, CR 80 with 1.45 miles of double seal, CR 18 with 2.71 miles of double seal, CR 3 with 3.05 miles of double seal, CR 20 with 1.53 miles of double seal and CR 132 with 1.21 miles of double seal. The county crews completed 44 different drainage improvements and culvert replacements installations on our County Road system in 2022 at a total cost of \$338,418. Statistics for road treatment for the winter of 2021-2022; the county crew responded to 31 events, worked 1592.25 hours of regular time and 796.25 hours of overtime; they drove 32,518.90 miles, used 1,652.45 tons of salt and 1,028.18 tons of cinders/grits for a total material cost of \$110,682.00. In 2022 the Engineers office replaced four bridges utilizing grants and local funds. Pending Road Projects in 2023 will be funded through a combination of County Engineers office funds and a pending OPWC grant. The planned projects are: CR 12 asphalt, CR 402 single seal, CR 79 single seal, CR 92 double seal, CR 436 FDR/single seal and CR 410 double seal and pending bridge projects for the 2023 year are as follows: CR 6-Bridge 10, TR 176-Bridge 5, TR 173-Bridge 1, CR 283-Bridge 1 and TR 338-Bridge 2. Additionally, there were 11 blanket utility permits and 10 project specific permits issued through the County Engineers office as they serve as the Floodplain Administrator for the Coshocton County Commissioners, the City of Coshocton and the Village of Warsaw. Mr. Wachtel stated that funding is the biggest challenge his office has currently, as they have to care for the 350 miles of road as well as the 269 bridges.

At 10 a.m. the bids for the Coshocton County CDBG PY 21- Village of West Lafayette Flood/Drainage Facilities & Street Improvements Project were opened with the following person in attendance: Mr. KJ Mason, Kinsey Excavating, Ms. Freda Troyer, MJ Excavating, Mr. Don Wells, William Albert Inc, Mr. Pat Perry, Dirt Dawg Excavating, Mr. Dustin Bower, Stull Excavating Inc and Ms. Tammy Hicks, Village of West Lafayette. Mr. Conkle read the following bids aloud: Kinsley Excavating with a bid of A-\$474,726.17 and B-\$240,644.21, MJ Excavating with a bid of A-\$389,852.00 and B-\$207,295.99, William Albert Inc with a bid of A-\$506,644.00 and B-\$207,928.78, Dirt Dawg Excavating with a bid of A-\$514,626.00 and B-\$228,241.20, Stull Excavating with a bid of A-\$478,241.94 and B-\$289,720.20 and Tucson Inc with a bid of A-\$546,027.55 and B-\$195,047.19. The Engineers estimate for this project is A-\$510,200.00 and B-\$257,600.00. The bids were turned over to CDC of Ohio for their Engineer to review and give recommendation.
