At 9:00 a.m. Mr. Fischer made a motion, seconded by Mr. Conkle to go into executive session to discuss the Opioid Ligation. All vote aye. At 9:15 a.m. the meeting was returned to regular session. No action taken.

At 10:00 a.m. there was a bid opening for the CDBG-Village of West Lafayette Neighborhood Revitalization, with the following people present: Mr. Dane Shryock, Commissioner, Mr. Gary Fischer, Commissioner, Mr. Rick Conkle, Commissioner, Mrs. Robin Schonauer, Budget Director, Ms. Hannah Diewald, CDC of Ohio and Mr. Bruce St. Clair, Melway Paving. Mr. Shryock read the following bids aloud: Melway Paving Co Inc, of Holmesville with a bid of \$395,082.05 and Kinsey Excavating & Trucking of New Philadelphia with a bid of \$435,646.85. The Engineer's Estimate for the CDBG Village of West Lafayette Neighborhood Revitalization Project is \$429,341.00. Mr. Conkle made a motion, seconded by Mr. Fischer to turn the bids over to CDC of Ohio for their review and recommendation.

At 11:00 a.m. Mr. Bradley Kennedy, Representative of Senator JD Vance introduced himself to the Coshocton County Commissioners' Mr. Bradley services 21 counties in the Southeastern district of Ohio, attending ribbon cuttings, events, meetings, etc. He would like to hear more about the goals of each of his 21 counties as each county has different needs. Additionally, he is available to help with grants that may benefit our county. Mr. Shryock stated that he attended Senator Vance's campaign stop when he came through Coshocton, and believes that Senator Vance understands local issues and federally the importance of protecting our society. Mr. Shryock then spoke of the old AEP ground that is being de-commissioned by Frontier out of Buffalo, NY. This 500-acre site is close to Intel and can generate 450 mega-watts of power in and out of the site. Lastly, Mr. Shryock spoke of the importance of the 4-lane to be finished within the 7 miles to have it complete. Mr. Kennedy said it is always better to ask for more and be told "no" than not ask for anything. Mr. Frederick T. Wachtel and Mr. Joshua Kempf, Coshocton County Engineer's office were also both present to speak of their troubles within the Engineers' office. Mr. Wachtel talked about the new program mandates that the Engineers' office is made complete, however the extra funds to complete these mandates are not offered. For example, this year they are required to complete a bridge inventory for the federal government at a cost of \$1250.00/per bridge. These new mandated programs take money out of his budget to complete. Mr. Wachtel stated if the mandates are so important for us to complete, then give us the funds to complete them as this is a huge burden on the rural county engineers. Mr. Shryock's closing statements were in regards to the issue of the crisis on the border, as this crisis is hurting the working class with jobs, money and food. Additionally, the drugs that are coming over the border are hurting the already effected opioid epidemic we are in through the us. Mr. Shryock thanked Mr. Kennedy for his time and as well as many thanks to Senator Vance for his representation in our community.

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


