Mental Health and Recovery Services Board-Levy Discussion

At 11:00 a.m. Janette Hall, Co-Executive Director at Coshocton Behavior Health Choices, Misty Cromwell, Executive Director with Mental Health and Recovery Board, Tom Wilson, Allwell and Rhonda Hains, Fascial Director for Mental Health and Recovery Board met with the Coshocton County Commissioners' to discuss the renewal of the Mental Health and Recovery Services Board levy. Ms. Cromwell stated the upcoming levy to be placed on the ballot is a 10-year renewal levy, this levy brings in roughly \$310,000/yearly. She invited Allwell and Coshocton Behavior Choices attend the meeting to discuss how they utilize levy monies in their facilities in Coshocton County. Mr. Wilson has been with Allwell for 18 years and stated the money his facility receives is used for many areas such as; prevention and education programs in all three county schools, crisis's screenings in both the jail and hospital and helping residents find resources tailored to their needs. Once an inmate is incarcerated in the jail system, they no longer have use of their Medicaid insurance, the levy dollars are used to pay the crisis's screening need to offer that inmate the help they may need. Unfortunately, must commercial insurance also does not fund a lot of services that those clients with mental health and recovery services may need, levy dollars help to fill in the gap with those clients as well. Additionally, Allwell provides resources for the homeless in the county with a case management team to help with any resource they may need. Lastly, Mr. Wilson talked about the creative ways the area groups team together to make the most of the levy funds with co-alliance's, within the county. Ms. Hall from Coshocton Behavior Health Choices spoke about the numerous ways her agency is using the levy funds such as; flight schools in all three county schools, help with autism training for parents and caretakers alike and therapy for both children and parents. Additionally, they have some great programs in the schools, "2 good for drugs" is a program for Kindergarten through 8th grade at River View and they also educate 6th-8th grades about the dangers of vaping as well. Ms. Hall stated the levy has been around for 40 years and hopes that the community see the benefit their agencies offer to those in need. Misty Cromwell spoke about partnering with other agency in the county such as Juvenile Court, Law Enforcement, Hospitals and JFS to address additional programs they see a need for. Resources are always available to law enforcement and first responders, as Ms. Cromwell stated she wants to make sure treatment or support is accessible if something happens while on the job and they would need counselling services. Rhonda Hains stated that emergency over-dose kits were purchased with levy dollars and given out to all the area schools. Ms. Hains said Coshocton is fortunate to have such great services in a small community and levy funds help everyone to be able to collaborate to make a bigger impact. Shryock thanked everyone for their timer. Fischer made a motion, seconded by Mr. Conkle to ask for Auditor's Certification for the Mental Health and Recovery Service Board Levy.


