Public Hearing-Vacation of CR 496, Tuscarawas Township

At 9:00 a.m. the Commissioners held a public hearing for the vacation of CR 496 with the following people present: Mr. Josh Kempf, Deputy Engineer. Mr. Shryock asked if Mr. Kempf had anything additional to add to the public hearing to which Mr. Kempf stated nothing new that was not said at the Public Viewing in regards to this vacation. A letter was read from the City of Coshocton: The City of Coshocton is opposed to the vacation of County Road 496. The City of Coshocton maintains infrastructure and owns property along this road, containing fire hydrants and a pump station. We feel that limited access will be detrimental to provide services safely and effectively. Mr. Kempf stated that the City will maintain an easement to all their infrastructure and their ability to access their property will not be limited by this road vacation. If the vacation were to be approved and a gate was installed, Mr. Kempf said keys would be passed out to all parties involved and numerous keys would be at the city. Mr. Shryock spoke with Mr. Don Wells, Tuscarawas Township Trustee about the township taking ownership on the road, Mr. Wells informed Mr. Shryock that their township meeting is Wednesday evening, September 13th and that this road vacation will be discussed. Mr. Shryock would like to hear back from the township as to their thoughts on this vacation before he makes a final decision. Mr. Kempf stated that if the vacation was not approved the County would rather just keep the road instead of giving it to the township. Mr. Shryock appreciates Mr. Kempf's comments and feedback. No decision was made today during the public hearing. At 9:15 a.m. Mr. Shryock closed the public hearing.
