Oversized Load Permits, Mr. Joshua Kempf, Deputy County Engineer

Mr. Joshua Kempf, Deputy County Engineer, Mr. Chris Johnson, Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Officer and Mr. Fred Wachtel, County Engineer attended the Commissioners meeting at 9:30 a.m. to discuss over sized permits. Mr. Kempf stated that the Engineers office will be getting ready to implement the new scales/permit program that would be in effect on County Roads only. Additionally, Mr. Kempf would like the Commissioners to pass a resolution that would establish issuance of oversized load permits through the County Engineers office. With the oversized load permits there will also be a fee schedule established, that fee schedule will be similar to the fee schedule in neighboring counties. Mr. Shryock asked how permits work on township roads, to which Mr. Kempf stated he is currently looking into that matter further. Mr. Johnson spoke briefly about what all his job as the commercial vehicle enforcement office will encompass; such as weighing trucks (semi's, dump trucks, cement trucks, trash trucks, etc.), making sure loads are safely secured as well as making sure trucks are in good working order. Mr. Johnson has been training in other counties with their commercial vehicle enforcement office for the last 3 weeks and has made great contacts and learned a lot. The program will begin with the permits, the education side of the program will come as Chris makes stops with individual drives and educates them on the issues of their trucks/loads. It was mentioned this will be a soft start for educational purposes for everyone. Mr. Wachtel is currently issuing blanket permits. Mr. Conkle hopes that this new program will be self-sufficient. Mr. Johnson spoke about how this program will save on road life over years to come-as those how are driving over weight trucks/loads are truly affecting our road conditions, most of this is coming off of the vibration from those vehicles. Mr. Kempf knows that not everyone will be happy about this program but he also realizes the need of the program for the longevity of the county roadways. Mr. Johnson knows this will be a learning curve for all and is ready to begin mid-December when his truck is ready. Mr. Shryock asked how many counties currently have this program, to which Chris stated roughly 28 counties have this program. Additionally, once again Mr. Johnson stated the counties that have this program are happy because this program is essentially helping to save their roads and bridges. Mr. Shryock thanked Chris for his presentation. In closing, Mr. Wachtel stated he hopes that they never write a ticket. Mr. Johnson will be working a 5-day schedule with flex hours/days. Currently ODOT has 36/60 listed as an alternate route for 70, which will bring more truck traffic to the Coshocton County area-and as the area grows on its own, the implantation of this program should be beneficial to the roads.

Proclamation for Mr. Jack Patterson

At 10:30 a.m. all three Commissioners attended the Proclamation presentation for Mr. Jack Patterson at the Commissioners Community Room. Mr. Patterson was recently inducted to into the Ohio Veterans Hall of Fame-Class of 2023. Throughout a lifetime of service to his community, Jack has demonstrated exemplary involvement and dedication of leadership to his country, county, Village of West Lafayette and various Veterans' Organizations. As a member of the Coshocton County Honor Guard, he has attended over 1100 military funerals to show respect and honor to his fellow fallen comrades. He has been a Veterans Advocate for 23 years on the County Veterans Service Commission and 42 years as Commander of the West Lafayette American Legion Post #466. He has flown on the Honor Flight Columbus 3 times as a Guardian and on October 7, 2021 as a Veteran to Washington DC to view the memorials and monuments. While serving as Mayor of West Lafayette for 24 years and given 31 years as a public servant, Jack has been involved with the Troop Train Memorial as well as working with West Lafayette Chamber of Commerce to promote the Village. Through his dedication and commitment to his country and county, he has been honored with this prestigious award. Mr. Shryock thanked Mr. Patterson for his service and presented him with the Proclamation.
