Mrs. Tammy Fox, River View Local Schools-Appalachian Innovation Grant

At 9:30 a.m. Mrs. Tammy Fox-Behavior Specialist and Mr. Charles Rinkes-Superintendent of River View Local Schools presented the Commissioners with information regarding the Appalachian Innovation Grant. River View Local Schools is looking for a letter of support to apply for \$45,450,000.00 in grant funds, which will cover three (2) grants. One grant will address the Appalachian Community Center, this project will provide the community with benefits of having a community pool, gymnasium, and Healthplex Facility. Additionally, this grant will allow the community to have access to quality health care, fitness, and community related activities on the campus of River View Local Schools. The Second grant will be for the Cultural Facilities grant, which will help to repair and renovate the auditorium, which is in desperate need of repairs that the school cannot afford. Although these facilities will be housed within the River View School District, they will be used for both educational purpose and public use. River View Local District continues to seek ways to weave the community into the fabric of its educational and outreach programs. If awarded, this type of facility will impact our community in a significant manner by providing accessible health care and counseling services, physical health opportunities and cooperative Mrs. Fox stated she realizes this is an ambitious plan, however, she believes now is the time. Additionally, Mr. Rinkles spoke of the struggles the school is having financially, currently the boiler needs repaired and the school lacks the funds to make those needed repairs. River View Local Schools has tried many times to pass a tax levy, with no success-which leaves the school looking to find other ways to raise monies for needed renovations and repairs. The closing of AEP hurt the River View Local School District significantly, the school is working to rebound from that lose, with a lower rate of enrollment in the schools. The Commissioners were in favor of signing a letter of support for the school.

Community Input, Mr. Ricky Lipps

Community Input: Mr. Ricky Lipps attended the Commissioners meeting to discuss trash within the City of Coshocton. He stated that money is being spent to make Coshocton look nice and the amount of litter due to people and trash can lids not being appropriately closed is causing trash to be spread throughout the city. Mr. Shryock asked if Mr. Lipps had been to the City yet to discuss his concerns as these issues would be withing their jurisdiction. Mr. Lipps has not been to the city to address these concerns yer, additionally, Mr. Shryock encouraged Mr. Lipps to possibly look at adopting a street within the City of Coshocton for litter collection. Lastly, Mr. Lipps spoke about an address issue, as two residents in close proximity of each other share the same house number-causing numerous mail issues. Mr. Shryock once again stated that this issue was another City of Coshocton to address.

Jesse Tubbs, Mayor of West Lafayette

Mrs. Jesse Tubbs, Mayor of West Lafayette attended the Commissioner meeting as an informational session and to also discuss the upcoming West Lafayette Trash Clean Up Day on April 20th from 9:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. This Clean-Up will have dumpsters available for trash, scrap, recycling as well as a dumpster for tires for all to use.
