Mr. Todd Shroyer and Ms. Kayla Chapman, EMS

At 9:05 a.m. Mr. Todd Shroyer, EMS Director and Ms. Kayla Chapman, Assistant Chief of Administration and Mr. Joe Hunt, Assistant Chief attended the meeting to discuss the addition of possibly two (2) new trucks to their fleet. Mr. Shroyer stated that the current fleet/ambulances are getting old and unreliable when over 100,000 are on them, which seven (7) are currently in that range. Mr. Shroyer would like to start the process of purchasing two (2) new ambulances in the next year, however, he would need to have the bidding for these this year to have them by the end of 2025. These vehicles cost roughly \$300,000 each, additionally, he would like to outfit each of the new vehicles with power-load cots, which cost an additional \$35,000. The cots are much needed in today's society, in which patients are larger and more difficult to carry. There have been back-injuries that related to such task that have ended employee's employment, as well as the BWC claims that effective EMS for a three (3) year timeframe. Lastly, Mr. Shroyer would like to start the CPR classes back up, as many churches, teachers, Amish businesses, dental offices and foster homes have been inquiring about the classes. Mr. Shryock stated he is ok with EMS moving forward with the new vehicles as well as the CPR trainings.
