Zoom Call-SpyGlass-Telecom Cost Analysis

At 10:00 a.m. Mr. Drew Ade with SpyGlass presented the Commissioners with an overview of how SpyGlass could potentially save money for the County via Zoom. Mr. Ade began by stating that the company has been in business for 25 years and that they work with clients to help supply them with a cost cutting analysis that would benefit the clients. SpyGlass will have a team work with the county to provide them with the resources to look over the phone, internet, cable, fax, cloud storage, cell phone and all telecom services that the county currently has to look for any services that could potentially be cut to eliminate and reduce spending on unnecessary services. Mr. Ade stated that SpyGlass worked with the county in 2015 and found \$79,311.38 in savings. Spyglass in only paid if savings are found, if no savings are found then there would not be a cost to the county for the services performed. However, if cost were found, SpyGlass would charge a 50% fee on the savings found. Currently the company has 14,500+ clients in the US and Canada, from 2022-2024 their clients' seen savings of 100 million. At the end of the engagement, SpyGlass will provide the county all items found to review what actions the county would like to move forward with. Mr. Shryock believes this would be a good time to start the process, seconded by Mr. Fischer, as he said it is time to do this again. Mr. Ade will work with Mrs. Schonauer to begin the process of collecting 2 months of bills to review

Solar panels in Tiverton Township Discussion

Mrs. Mary Beck, County Administrator informed the Commissioners about a voicemail that was received in the office from a Mr. Dan Renwald, from Tiverton Township.
