Ms. Evelyn Morrison, OSU Community Development Educator - Introduction

t 9:00 a.m. Mrs. Emily Marrison, OSU Extension, Mrs. Jennie Strickler and Ms. Evelyn Morrison attended the Commissioners meeting to introduce Ms. Morrison to the Commissioners as the new Community Development Educator for the Extension office. Emily, originally from Beach City, Ohio, has been meeting with community members to learn about local needs and explore how she can best serve Coshocton. Mr. Shryock welcomed her and expressed his appreciation for her willingness to help move the community forward.

Mr. Shryock emphasized the importance of understanding the role of government in economic development, noting that many members of the public are not aware of why the Port Authority was formed. He also pointed out that there are many exciting developments happening in Coshocton, making this a good time for strong leadership within the community. Mr. Bigrigg welcomed Emily to her new position, stating that there are many opportunities in the community and stressing the shared goal of increasing business growth and moving forward together. He highlighted the benefits that the Conesville area will bring, such as hotels, restaurants, and construction activity.

Also noted that part of Evelyn's position will involve working closely with the Port Authority, including sharing office space with the new Our Towne Director and maintaining consistent communication with the Port. Housing was also discussed as a pressing need in the area. The limited local housing market makes it difficult for professionals to relocate, and a housing study will be conducted to address this concern. Mr. Shryock added that Coshocton has seen many professionals move out of the area, and while commuting is more common now, retaining professionals locally remains an important goal.

Mr. Fischer expressed his appreciation for Evelyn's arrival, welcoming her to Coshocton. Evelyn commented on how welcoming the community has been, noting that she has never experienced such a supportive environment. Evelyn shared her excitement to begin her role, which is part of a three-year program funded by the Schooler Foundation. Mr. Shryock concluded by recognizing the significant support local foundations have provided to the Extension Office and the broader community, noting that Evelyn's position is designed to assist with anything that can help Coshocton move forward.


Meetings Attended
